We have a supply of Vetch, or Vetch and oat mix available, but a lot of this hay is rain effected, and will be priced according to tests.

High quality, with no rain damage will be very hard to locate.

Oaten hay is available in 8x4x8 and 8x4x3 bales. We will have good quality, as well as rain damaged hay for sale.

We will be looking for contract work, especially cutting and conditioning with our Krone Big M. This machine has been fitted with superconditioner rollers, and can cut up to 15ha/per hour.

Anyone interested in *hay purchases*, especially vetch or high quality hay should give us a call to discuss their options. The best quality hay is usually the first to go, and many buyers end up paying the same price for lesser quality product.
